


When talking about career planning, you can think of it as an easy 3 step process:

- 1. Knowing Yourself
- 2. Exploring Options
- 3. Taking Action

This booklet will guide you through the career planning process. As we discuss each step, think of how your life experiences play into your career goals.





KNOW YOURSELF

Knowing and evaluating yourself is the first (and one of the most crucial) steps in successful career planning. It is important to know and understand who you are as a person and who you want to become in your life and career.

During this stage, you want to ask yourself some of the following questions:

What am I passionate about?

What inspires me?

Who is my support system?

What are my values and beliefs?

What is my personality type?

What skills and abilities do I have?

What do I want to do for work?

What do I need in a workplace? (i.e., travel, pay, helping, etc.)

What are my favourite subjects?

EXPLORE OPTIONS

After you have a sense of what interests you and what you want in life, it's time to explore your options! What kind of careers can you do? Where can you study subjects you're interested in?

During this stage, you want to ask yourself the following questions:

What kind of careers are out there?
What career paths or fields interest me?
Where can I get training for occupations that interest me?

What are the job prospects like in Manitoba? How much money could I make in this field?

This is where Set Your Course is handy. With over 400 careers on the site, you can explore careers that match your skills and interests and look at Manitoba-specific labour market information, including average salaries, occupation outlooks, and where in Manitoba you can train for that career!
