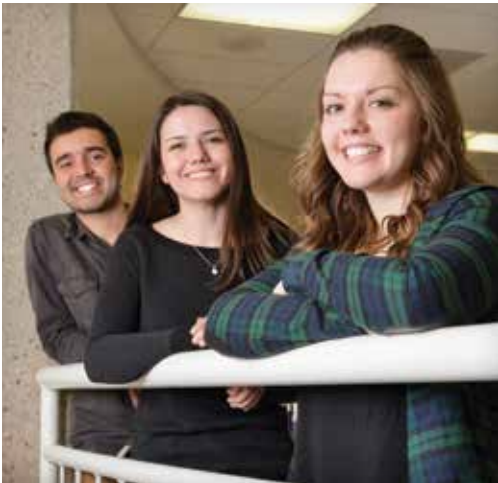
## LA CITÉ UNIVERSITAIRE FRANCOPHONE
