ARTS EDUCATION

The Arts Education program

- Prepares teachers to work in K-12 schools (Elementary and Highschools) and alternative educational settings.
- Students are required to take core interdisciplinary Arts Education courses in the following areas: Dance, drama, literature, music, and visual arts.
- Students select an arts concentration.
- Program includes a variety of practical experiences.
- A combined Bachelor of Education (4 year)/Bachelor of Arts (3 year) is possible in some Arts Education concentrations.

BACCALAURÉAT EN ÉDUCATION

The Baccalauréat (Bac) en Éducation program

- Prepares teachers to work in French (Francophone or French immersion schools and Core French) in Elementary or Secondary schools.
- French is the major area of study for all Bac programs.
- The secondary program requires a minor in one of the following areas: mathematics, social sciences, fine arts, physical education, English, or general sciences.
- Students receive most of their instruction in French.
- Students are required to complete their second year at Laval University in Québec City.

SECONDARY EDUCATION

The Secondary Education program

- Prepares teachers for employment in highschools.
- Students develop knowledge of content and teaching ability in their major and minor subject areas.
- Major subject areas are English, French (core), health, mathematics, music, physical education, social studies, and sciences (including biology, chemistry, general science, and physics). Miinor subject areas are dance, drama, English, French, health, mathematics, music, outdoor education, physical education, social studies, inclusive education, visual education, and sciences (including biology, chemistry, general science, and physics).
- The following 5-year combined Bachelor degrees are offered: B.Ed./B.Kin. (Physical Education/Physical Literacy), B.Ed./B.Mus. (Music Education and Music), and B.Ed./B.Sc. (Mathematics Education and Mathematics).

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

The Elementary Education program

- Prepares teachers for employment in elementary schools (pre-K to Grade 5) or Middle years (Grades 6 - 9). schools.
- Students develop knowledge in the following core curricular areas: arts education, health, English language arts, mathematics, physical education, science, and social studies.

Each program area leads to a 4-year Bachelor of Education degree and full teacher certification.

Students in each program will experience several in-school experiences and a semester-long internship

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS (for students from a Saskatchewan highschool)

- English Language Arts A30 and B30
- One math or science course chosen from Apprenticeship and Workplace Mathematics 30, Biology 30, Calculus 30, Chemistry 30, Computer Science 30, Foundations of Mathematics 30, Geology 30, Math A30 and B30 or C30, Pre-Calculus 20 and 30, and Physics 30.
- One language, social science, or fine arts course chosen from Arts Education 30, Band 30, Choral 30, Christian Ethics 30, Cree 30, Dance 30, Dene 30, Drama 30, Economics 30, French 30, Geography 30, German 30, History 30, Latin 30, Law 30,
- Mandarin 30, Music 30, Native Studies 30, Physical Education 30, Psychology 30, Saulteaux 30, Social Studies 30, Ukrainian Language Arts 30, and Visual Art 30. One additional course from the lists above. (NOTE: only one of Music 30, Band 30, or Choral 30 will be accepted for admission.)
- Minimum average of 65%
- Additional factors: teaching-related experiences, essay content, and experience and proficiencies in program majors (Arts Education and Secondary Education)
